Amazing Whales

Whales are amazing animals. We love whales so much. We think they're so cool and we hope you do too. Today we will be talking about four different species: blue whales, humpback whales, beluga whales, and dolphins.

Blue Whales



As you probably know blue whales are the biggest animals on earth. A blue whale's tongue is the weight of an elephant! They can grow up to 91 feet or more. A blue whale's life span can be up to 90 years. Their weight can be 200,00 to 300,00 pounds (900,000-136,000 kilograms). They are carnivores, which means they feed on flesh. Blue whales make the loudest sound on earth. They can swim up to 25 mph or faster! A blue whale can excrete 58 gallons of poo at a time. They have the biggest babies on Earth. They come out at 26 feet long and 8,800 pounds. There's so much trash going into the ocean whales are choking on trash and dying. Whales are getting beached.

Humpback Whales



Humpback whales roam all over the world. In the summer blue whales spend most of their time in the Gulf of Alaska and the Gulf of Maine. Humpback whales do not have teeth, they have 270 to 400 fingered over-lapping plates called baleen plates that they use to mostly feed on small fish, krill, and plankton. Humpbacks can grow up to 60 feet. Their fins can be 16 feet long. Humpbacks are not the biggest whales. The blue whale is the biggest. Why humpbacks breach: Scientists say that whales breach because they might have a Barnacle or parasites that makes them itch or they might be communicating.

Dolphins

There are 36 species of marine dolphins. Dolphins stick with their mothers for three to eight years then they leave the pods. They have two stomachs; one is used for storage of food, and one is used for digestion. Dolphins never chew, they swallow their food whole. Their teeth are only used for hunting. They can swim up two three to seven miles per hour, but some go a little faster at 20 miles per hour. They have delicate skin, but even deep cuts can heal quickly. Dolphins mainly eat fish, squid, and some species of killer whales may eat turtles. Killer whales are the biggest species of dolphin. They can weigh 110 to 2200 pounds. Their lifespan can be 30 to 60 years.



Beluga Whales

Beluga whales are among the smallest species of whale. Adults can be 13 to 20 ft long and they like to live in the cold. You can find them in and around the Arctic oceans. Beluga whales can swim backwards. Also, they can change the shape of their forehead called a "melon," by blowing air around its sinuses. Like many whale species, a group of beluga whales are called pods. Beluga whales usually live 35 to 50 years, and their weight is 1 to 1.5 tons, which is 2000-3000 pounds! They are also called "sea canaries". They are the most vocal of all whales. When a beluga whale is born, they are dark gray and not white; it can take up to 8 years for them to get fully white.

All About Ramadan and Eid Al-Fitr

Hi! My name is Petra Alsmadi. I am a girl. And I am half Jordanian and half American. I celebrate a holiday called Ramadan. Ramadan is a month in the Hijri calendar (Ramadan, 2022). The date is 10 days earlier every year because the Hijri calendar is a lunar calendar which follows the moon. This year, Ramadan starts on Saturday April 2 and ends on May 1. Ramadan is a Muslim holiday. There are Muslims from countries all over the world. This holiday lasts a whole month. Part of Ramadan requires adults to fast.

Quick Fact: If you are wondering, fasting, for example, is not eating or drinking from sunrise to sunset. But, Muslims also do not smoke, kiss, or get angry while they are fasting for Ramadan.

During fasting, Muslims try to be peaceful and happy. Not every Muslim has to fast. Pregnant women, sick people, young children, old people, and long travelers do not have to fast, but they should make up the days later if they can or give money to charity or donate food to make up for it.

How Ramadan Works In My Family

I sometimes try to fast for maybe half a day even though I'm still a child. Children can fast for half a day for practice. In my family, my dad wakes up early and eats early breakfast (or suhoor) before the sun comes up. My mom doesn't usually wake up early. Sometimes I wake up early and eat something and try to fast in the morning and sometimes I try for the afternoon. I remember once I offered my parents a snack during the day and they said no because they were fasting. I remember last year my parents would eat dinner later than me, but they would still make dinner for me and then they would eat after I go to bed. My dad or mom would make me dinner at around 5 or 6 o'clock.

If Ramadan is in the summer, the sun stays up longer, so it is harder to fast. Once my dad was making me something for dinner, and I remember him actually tasting it while he was supposed to be fasting. I asked him why he was eating it and he said that he didn't actually eat it, he just spit it out. He told me a cool fact, apparently you can taste things as long as you don't eat it. I appreciate how he was tasting it for me to make sure it was good. During Ramadan we eat a lot of dates.

Reasons We Celebrate Ramadan

1. God told us to
2. It helps us understand what it feels like to be on the streets and not have any food. We feel more empathy for other people, and it could encourage us to donate and share and take care of others.
3. It helps us be grateful for what we have and not be so greedy

At the end of Ramadan is Eid al Fitr. In my family we would have a celebration at the mosque, and we would celebrate together. We have a big feast with lots of treats and meet people and have fun. You know how we had to fast? On Eid we are required to eat and have fun. Fasting is not allowed on Eid.

On Eid I get candy and new clothes, and sometimes money. I also like to give gifts to other children. It makes me feel good to give presents. We decorate the house and spend time with our grandparents. Last time there was a carnival at the mosque, with balloons and games and an ice cream stand. I think Eid is a very fun tradition.

Mansaf- A Traditional Eid Recipe from Jordan

Mansaf is a delicious recipe made with lamb, rice, yogurt sauce, toasted cashews and pine seeds, parsley, and sometimes bread on the bottom.



Ingredients:

- Lamb shoulder
- Pine seeds
- Cashews
- Parsley
- Rice
- Ghee
- Greek yogurt
- Cardamom
- Bay leaves
- Salt
- Turmeric
- Onion
- Flat bread if you prefer

Step 1 - Cook the lamb shoulder in a giant pot of boiling water with and cardamom and bay leaves and a couple of chopped up onions, until the meat is tender (could take 2-3 hours)

Step 2 - Cook a lot of rice, probably 4-6 cups

Step 3 - Add water and boil the yogurt with ghee and spices - turmeric, salt, cardamom

Step 4 - Toast a couple handfuls of cashews and pine seeds in a pan

Step 5 - Take the meat out of the pot and add it to the yogurt, continue to cook

Step 6 - Assemble all the ingredients on a giant platter: put down a layer of bread over the platter, then cover the whole surface with cooked rice, then spoon the meat over the rice, then pour yogurt sauce all over everything, then sprinkle the toasted nuts on top, then sprinkle the chopped-up parsley to garnish. Eat straight off the platter with a spoon or your hands.

Ukranianian Easter Eggs (Pysanka)

A Step-by-Step Tutorial

Hello readers, I don't know if you've heard but currently, there is a war going on between Russia and Ukraine. Because war can be scary, I've decided to appreciate Ukraine's culture instead. Fifty years ago, my grandparents ("Poppy" or Andy Rauer and "Nonnie" or Alice Rauer) met a woman named Mary Beth Orevce who taught them how to make these special eggs. This was before they were even married! Now, it's a family tradition that all my cousins and I do.

DISCLAIMER This is not a simple craft made from things you find in your house. Many things will have to be purchased. But don't worry, it's totally worth it.

Step 1: Set aside empty jars with large openings that could fit an egg. Red sauce jars, salsa jars, peanut butter jars. Those will all work if they have a large opening. Four or five jars will even be enough, it just depends on how many colors you want your eggs. If you didn't catch on, the jars are for dyeing the Ukrainian eggs. The Ukrainian egg dyes are very strong, and if you split them on your countertops that stain will never go away.

Step 2: Eggs, eggs, and eggs. We are not baking though. If you read the title, then hopefully you already have some eggs set out. Take a needle or safety pin and pierce the top and bottom of the egg with a needle. Hopefully in the end your eggs will have two small holes.

Step 3: Can you hold your breath? Good, 'cause you're going to need it. You may know that inside of an egg is a yolk and the whites. These edible parts will not do. So, you must blow them out. Gather up as much air as you can in your lungs and place your mouth to the hole you created. It might take a few tries, and if you're really struggling ask an adult. You can save the yolk and whites for breakfast.



Step 4: Now that you're prepared, it's time for you to find the other tools: Beeswax, any candle, a kistka (writing tool or stylus), and dyes. Sometimes you can find all of these in a kit. Simply look up: "pysanky egg kit" on any search engine. These kits can range from \$10-\$30.

Step 5: Those holes you made are bad too. So, we need to cover them up. If your holes aren't covered, the dyes will leak inside of your egg when you dip them. Take your candle and light it. Also, here is a reminder: The beeswax is not for lighting! Use your leftover candle instead.



Heat up your kistka with the lit candle. Then, scoop up beeswax with the indentation on your kistka. Put your kistka back in the flame, indent up. Don't pour the beeswax into the candle. Now, you can fill the holes. Place your kistka on the edge of your egg's hole. Work your way with the wax and fill the holes.

Step 6: Grab a pencil and sketch a design. You can also take a piece of paper, draw an egg shape, and practice. Make sure you draw on the egg lightly. If not, the pencil markings will show through.



Step 7: Think about what you want white on the egg. When you cover up the pencil lines with wax, those parts stay white!

Step 8: Repeat what you did to cover the holes: Put your kistka in the lit candle, scoop up some beeswax, and reheat your kistka. Trace your pencil designs. Beware, sometimes if you hold your kistka in the heat too long, blobs will come out on the egg when you are tracing. But right now, only trace the parts you want WHITE!

Step 9: Time to prepare the dyes. Boil some distilled water (if available) then put the water into the jars. Add the dye packages to the water (mix until incorporated), then add a tablespoon of white vinegar. Finally, add a cup of cold distilled water.



Step 10: Now that you've made the dyes, choose a color. Remember the parts you're covered with wax will stay white. Carefully dip your egg into a jar. Now you can do Step 7 again, just for your new color. Repeat with different colors if you want.



Step 11: Now that you have all your colors it's time to take the wax off. Let your parents do this step. Hold the egg carefully above the normal candle. Let the beeswax drip off.

Step 12: This is optional, but, if you want your egg to be preserved for many years, it is recommended that you apply a thin layer of varnish over the egg.

Now you're done! Congratulations! Don't break them!

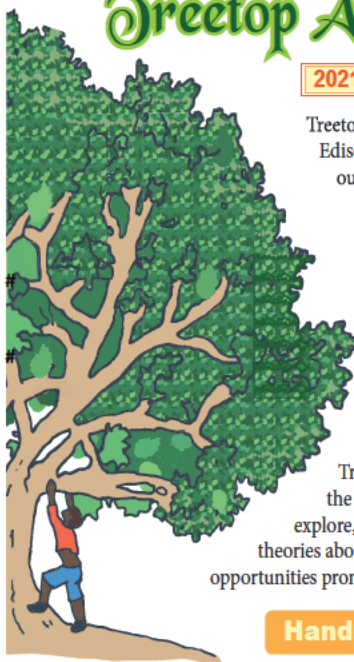

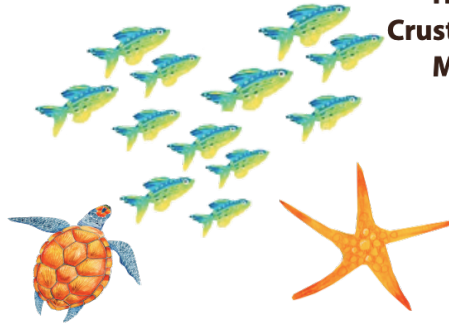
