Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients

½ cup butter

1 1/2 cups white sugar

1 egg

1 cup canned pumpkin

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

21/3 cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon ground nutmeg

½ teaspoon cloves

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 cup semisweet chocolate chips ½ cup chopped walnuts (optional)

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F
- 2. In a large bowl, cream together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the egg, and then stir in the pumpkin and vanilla. Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, nutmeg, cloves,

Fun Recipies for Fall Roasted Pumpkin Seeds

You will need:

- 1 big spoon
- -1 pumpkin (or more) -1 strainer
- -1 cookie sheet
- Salt (paprika, garlic powder, and other spices of your choice are optional but recommended)

<u>Directions</u>: Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Carve the pumpkin and put the guts and seeds in a bowl; pick out as many guts as you can. Put the seeds in a strainer and rinse in the sink, set aside. Grease cookie sheet with cooking spray, and spread seeds evenly around. Salt, pepper and spices of your choice, about 1 teaspoon of the spices and sprinkle on seeds on sheet, mix with a spatula then put in preheated oven (have adult supervision). Bake seeds for about 30 minutes



and shake every ten minutes or so with adult help. Remove after 30 minutes or when brown. Add additional salt and pepper once cooled and place in your favorite jar and enjoy your fun seasonal snack!
